

Command Line Cheatsheet

This cheatsheet corresponds with this helpful screencast posted by Addison Berry on lullabot.com. Be sure to check out the video for more goodness.



command history

ctrl + P (or up arrow) = go to previous command

ctrl + N (or down arrow) = go to next command

ctrl + R = search (ctrl + R to scroll through, Esc to select but not execute)



moving

ctrl + **F** (or right arrow) = move forward one character

ctrl + B (or left arrow) = move backwards one character

ctrl + E = move to end of line

ctrl + A = move to beginning of line



deleting

ctrl + H (or back delete key) = one character backwards

ctrl + D = one character forward

ctrl + W = delete from cursor to beginning of word

ctrl + **U** = clear from cursor to beginning of line

ctrl + K = clear from cursor to end of line

fancy pants command history

Got this handy tip from Shawn Powers at LinuxJournal.

!! prints the previous command (see examples below)

touch file.txt

sudo !! (will execute "sudo touch file.txt")

or

diff file newfile

!! > changes.patch (will execute "diff file newfile > changes.patch")

^{*} Use tab for autocompletion of file or directory names
